

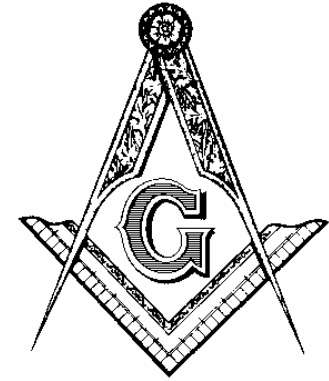
“Brotherhood At Work”

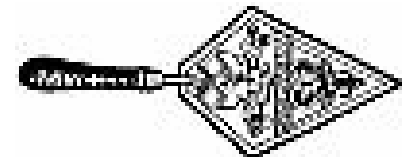

The tradition of Masonic architecture in the United States is grounded in a history far older than the establishment of this country. Many of the nation's founding fathers were themselves Freemasons, a fraternity derived from British stoneworkers similar to a guild or labor union, and the Masonic stamp is visible throughout the city of Washington, DC. It's radiating avenues and circles overlaying a grid pattern of right-angled streets hold a deep symbolism for this group of men present from the time Washington began to rise from tidal swamps and wooded hills lying along the banks of the Potomac.
